River Cleanup

On a glorious morning on Sunday 16th May, with blue skies overhead and the sun shining upon us, volunteers gathered at Brookmill Park to take part in a clear up of the Ravensbourne River.

In conjunction with Thames 21 and Glendale, waders and gloves were donned and people descended the banks into the water. Other volunteers manned the bank edge retrieving items removed from the water and transporting to waiting vehicles.

All involved performed a fantastic job - so much rubbish was removed an extra vehicle had to be ordered!!

It was amazing what we found numerous discarded wallets and purses, old clothes, carpets, cans, plastic and glass bottles, tyres, road signs, motorway cones, golf balls and the all too familiar shopping trolleys.

As well as the rubbish clearance it was also a good opportunity to see what wildlife was living in and around the river. Crabs, eels, some small fish and leeches were seen, as well as Moorhens, Coots, Canadian Geese and Mallards on the water.

Unfortunately there were no signs of the Kingfishers or the Heron which are so often seen in the park.

Early one evening in May one user of the park even saw bats flying around and they looked to be roosting in< nearby trees!!

ANOTHER SUCCESS!!

After seeing lots of other areas in Lewisham benefiting from the appearance of green boxes in order to recycle- the St John's Society pushed hard to be included. We had tried for months to get boxes without success. It was decided therefore to spend one week vigorously campaigning all Councillors, the Mayor and the local MP (who actually is quite vociferous in her support for recycling bins) -within 1 week they arrived!!

We hope all residents are taking advantage of recycling cardboard and paper in these bins. We also have additional recycling bins on Brookmill Rd for glass, paper and cans. There is a recycling point for old clothes close to the Lewisham roundabout -all plastic products can be taken to the Landmann Way recycling centre, Off Surrey Canal Road, New Cross, London, SE14 whose opening times are: April 1 - September 30: Sun to Fri: Sam to 7pm Saturday: Sam to 12 noon

October 1 - March 31 Sun to Fri: 8am to 4pm - Saturday: Sam to 12 noon

BE AWARE:

IT COULD BE COSTLY TO YOU!!!!

Living in a conservation area places certain restrictions on the works on property that can be carried out without planning permission.

Lewisham Council recently delivered a leaflet to residents of Brookmill Road Conservation area to remind them of the planning regulations generally arising from the Article 4 Direction which covers the Conservation area.

This means that planning permission may be required for works like replacing windows or doors, changing roof coverings, painting the front of a building, installing of satellite dishes or altering all or part of a boundary wall or fence.

It is costly to improve or make changes to your property - however it can be even more so if the council insist you put it back to how it was before. Check with the Council before you make any alterations to the outside of your building. If you would like further advice, you can call:

How nice for Tesco shoppers in Kensington that they can get in<shape with the help of swanky new "trim trolleys" (Shop till you slim, 27 April). Here in South-East London, we tone up by pulling out Tesco trolleys dumped in the local river.

This river is home to swans, herons, kingfishers - and trolleys, the source of which is Tesco's Lewisham branch. A nearby Asda recently fitted magnetic strips which stop trolleys leaving their store, but Tesco has refused. So on May 16, local residents will be keeping fit by wading waist-high to retrieve Tesco trolleys. We would be delighted if Tesco managers joined us so they too can benefit from fresh air and exercise without the benefit of trim trolleys.

As a result of this letter the Manager of Tesco's trolleys Worldwide decided the bad publicity demanded some action.

On the 15th May a Tesco's contracted firm arrived (a few hours before our river cleanup) and removed all the offending Tesco Trolleys.

A promise of a weekly inspection of the river and removal of any trolleys was made - although no promises to try to prevent the trolleys leaving the store grounds in the first place were given.

We shall monitor the situation closely - but it's nice seeing the occasional letter getting results!! -Thanks to Aiden!
