Update on noisy planes

In issue 9 of the 'Update', (November 2002), we informed you of the levels of noise from planes increasing in the St Johns area and we joined forces with local groups in Blackheath, Brockley and Greenwich in responding to the government consultation on the issue. Due to the force of feeling in the area, BAA have been careful in limiting the number and times of planes passing overhead. However, it has been noticed that these planes are on the increase again starting early in the morning and continuing until late at night.

TRIM YOUR BUSH!!

The St Johns Society sends out a plea for everyone to keep their bushes in check so that pedestrians can walk freely down the pavement. If you have already had a letter from the Council regarding this, it is worth taking action, as the Highway Dept can come and cut back the overhanging bushes and then charge you for the work. The situation is that if someone has already had a letter and the Council spots or someone reports overhanging bushes - the property owner gets 2 weeks to rectify the situation or else the Council will come and cut it down and charge the resident. However, if it is a Council property, they will do it free of charge if the tenant calls and asks for it to be done. A number of houses in the St Johns area have trees and bushes hanging over their boundary, onto the street. In some instances it has become so bad that access to the pavement is very restricted and people (and prams) are forced onto the road. Thanks.
