

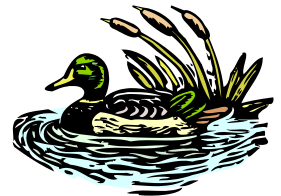

# A very sad sight indeed!!

After many attempts by local residents to save the historic water pumping station and former water managers office on Brookmill Road it was sad to see the bulldozers moving in to demolish the structure built circa 1862.

The site (part of the section 106 agreement from the development of the Deals Gateway – One SE8 Development) will now be passed to The Stephen Lawrence Charitable trust to build the new Stephen Lawrence Centre. Some residents are disappointed that the Centre's design could not incorporate the existing Victorian structure.

## ***Extracts from the Stephen Lawrence Charitable trust website:***

*The site, which was donated to the Trust by Berkeley Group Plc, will be developed using grants awarded by the Millennium Commission (MC) and the London Development Agency (LDA). We are also seeking funding for the [Creativity Arts Laboratory](#) from the Arts Council.*

***The Stephen Lawrence Centre is due to open in summer 2006.** It will offer services to the general population of the Lewisham area but will make a unique contribution in relation to improving the life chances of black Caribbean and African young people. The Centre will work closely with partners in the area to tackle under achievement and increase the motivation of young people to embrace education and overcome the barriers of the fulfilment of their potential in life.*

It is that time of year again when people start to leave their windows open at night to keep cool. I now have window locks on my sash windows which allow me to open them at night – but prevent anybody entering – a great idea.**

## **Do's and Don'ts**

**Do** Lock doors and windows (even the small ones) when you are out of your home (yes – even if just for a short while!)  
21% of burglaries are committed via unlocked doors.

**Do** get to know your neighbours and look out for each other (how about coming along to St John's Society meetings?)

**Do** check to see if you will need planning permission for security grills or changes to walls or windows

**Do** make sure your security measures wouldn't hinder your escape in case of a fire. Install fire alarms and keep door and window keys close to hand when at home

**Don't** leave spare keys to your home 'hidden' beneath doormats, in flowerpots etc. Thieves know where to look!

Instead ask a neighbour to keep a spare set for you in case of emergencies.

**Don't** keep car keys or purses etc. within sight or reach of your windows or doors – they can be gone in an instant.
