

Ashmead School Official Opening

Ashmead School had its official opening on Friday 27th March2009 attended by local councillors, Major Steve Bullock, other local VIP's and the press. It went through a total rebuilding programme last year, whilst the staff and pupils were decamped to the Mornington Centre in New Cross moving back last November.

The new school was designed by Bouygues UK and has 1,500 square metres of modern primary learning facilities for the 260 or so children attending the school. It has a new ICT suite, improved staff and admin areas, large airy classrooms overlooking the play area at the back of the school. Part of the brief was to retain as much of the old, much loved playground with its varied levels, areas and established trees, whilst on a practical level giving space for the much needed multi-sports ground.

Much thought has been put into the design and construction of a new school in a confined inner city conservation area. We think that they have done a superb job and wish the staff and pupils much joy and good learning!

The children put on a special musical performance and look as though they have settled in very well. We wish the staff and all the pupils of Ashmead School the very best.

Stephen Lawrence Centre

The Stephen Lawrence Centre was open during Open House weekend and I had a very interesting look around at the studios there. They have recording studios and two computer suites and run courses for young people. It is well used by local students and a number of educational courses as well as an architectural design course are on offer.

Creekside Centre

The Creekside Centre had its first meeting for Friends of Deptford Creek and it raised a number of concerns about the developments along Deptford Creek and the River Ravensbourne. The height of the new buildings and the adverse effect on the ecology of the creek and the river were discussed. A lot of the creek will be overshadowed by these buildings. Plants and creatures living in the creek and the river will struggle to survive without the sunlight. The Creek itself will disappear into a huge canyon of tall buildings. A number of boat dwellers will be affected by overbuilding along the waterside; and Lewisham College are planning a 13 storey building on their present site on Deptford Broadway.
