6	Update: Planning	<ul> <li>Re-think meetings. Fewer needed. More could be decided by email. A simple template will be devised.</li> <li>SJS need to report how many planning applications that we respond to.</li> <li>AS + NB are now jointly responsible as our Planning Officers (SJS) and will arrange to meet with Cllr Stephen when possible, to liaise further</li> <li>Bolton St Bike Shed – Planning refused by LBC.</li> </ul>
7	Update: Trees	<ul> <li>Mature trees are very important.</li> <li>LB to meet Cllr Krupski and report back to SJS Committee</li> <li>SELCP £2000 given to us for tree planting and they are happy to roll this over to next year and new roads identified for the planting.</li> <li>We have had to identify sites to plant trees (in collaboration with STfL). It has been quite a challenge as not all home-owners want a tree on the pavement outside their house. It has been difficult to get the permission (which we like to have as a courtesy) before planting the trees.</li> <li>Although there are worries that trees decrease the value of property, it in fact has the opposite effect.</li> <li>The last of the 3 trees that SJS had crowdfunded for, finally got put in, after a delay that was chased up not only by SJS but our local councillors and representatives in LBC.</li> <li>Brookmill Park Update: 30 trees were donated by a local resident and have now been planted in the park, following the uproar of so many trees being cut down in January.</li> </ul>
